Elite Spice, Inc. is a family-owned business best known for our safe, wholesome spices and seasoning blends we have provided to the food industry since being founded in 1988.

Starting with 14 employees and 20,000 square feet of manufacturing space, we have grown substantially and our operations now encompass six separate facilities, located in Maryland and Nevada, totaling over one million square feet and employing more than 800 people.

Our company's foundation is built on family values and the commitment to ensure safe, responsibly sourced and sustainably processed products in a manner that protects our employees, the community and the environment, now and for future generations.

Our Mission

Since the inception of the Sustainability Taskforce in 2019, Elite Spice has been evaluating our impact in the food system by seeking to understand our economic, social and environmental influences. We began with determining sustainable practices currently in place and identifying areas of weakness to improve on. In recent years we have developed a formal program to best monitor and track data on our sustainability program, such as energy usage, natural resource usage, waste generation, and recycling.

As a company, we are committed to taking a systems-based approach to understand the interactions among the three pillars of sustainability in an effort to manufacture our spices and seasoning blends in the most responsible way possible.







Our Approach Three Pillars of Sustainability



The goal of sustainability, derived from the U.S. National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA), is to, "create and maintain conditions, under which humans and nature can exist in productive harmony, that permit fulfilling the social, economic, and other requirements of present and future generations."

By separating our goals into three distinct sectors of sustainability, Elite Spice has been able to identify opportunities for improvements and act upon them more effectively.

These pillars include; environmental, social and economic responsibilities. Elite Spice's goal is ultimately profit and growth while achieving our goals in social and environmental responsibility.

Suppliers are required to certify that all of the materials incorporated into each product supplied to Elite Spice are manufactured in a responsible manner. This includes enforcing compliance with all laws regarding forced labor, such as; child labor, slavery and human trafficking.

Supplier Diversity

Elite Spice maintains a diverse supplier base and has fostered trusting relationships over the last 30+ years of business. These relationships establish open communication and economic stability for both partners. Constantly vetting new, small- to medium- sized suppliers gives opportunities for growth while buffering Elite Spice's position against supply chain disruption.

Elite Spice participates in the local Howard County work release program. This program provides a transition into the workforce for inmates convicted of non-violent offenses in preparation for their eventual release from confinement.

We regularly hire students from surrounding colleges and universities as paid summer interns. These interns return to fall semester with experience in a manufacturing setting with emphasis on food safety and the spice supply chain. Several of these interns have returned to work at Elite Spice full time after graduating.






our commitment to our Planet

Mission

Elite Spice is taking steps to analyze and reduce our overall footprint. This is being accomplished by surveying energy usage, product distribution, water consumption, product and packaging waste and other indirect areas of our business that may negatively impact the environment. Through this analysis we have found new ways to recycle and areas of improvement for others, which has significantly reduced the amount of waste discarded.

In 2020, Elite Spice joined Maryland's Green Registry Program, demonstrating our commitment to the environment and sustainable business practices. As a green business, we also support other Green Registry members, including several ingredient suppliers and our packaging manufacturer who is a certified Sustainable Forestry Initiative Manufacturer.









Responsible Material Sourcing

Elite Spice sources raw materials from suppliers who also value sustainability. Some of the environmentally responsible programs implemented by our suppliers include; efficient irrigation systems that save water and energy, ongoing employee education and taking steps to mitigate man-animal conflict.

Energy & Water Usage

Compared to other food manufacturers, Elite Spice uses very little water. As many of our processes are dry, water is introduced only during mixing operations. Water is essential for the proper cleaning and cannot be reduced for those applications, but the amount is minimal.

We have also implemented several programs and practices to reduce energy usage:



- sensing fixtures.
 - 99% complete switching to LED in manufacturing and warehouse areas.
 - Many of the office areas have been replaced- currently a work in progress.

Freight transportation is a large contributor to air pollution and is only predicted to increase in the future. In 2020, Elite Spice became a U.S. EPA SmartWay Shipper. Companies that participate in the SmartWay program have access to tools which aid in measuring, benchmarking and assessing freight transportation activities and strategically making better choices that reduce emissions.

Elite Spice offers employees subsidized bus passes. This not only alleviates direct transportation costs for our Baltimore City employees, but alleviates the environmental costs of transportation through public transit.

Recycling & Reduction of Waste

Elite Spice continues to find opportunities to reduce, reuse & recycle single stream waste products. Materials commonly recycled include; wooden pallets, plastic pallets, paper waste, corrugated cardboard and more recently, spice waste. Wooden pallets and bailed cardboard are returned to our suppliers to be refurbished into new, usable pallets and finished product boxes.






Our People
